PRINCIPAL'S ANNOUNCEMENTS: FULL OPEN MODEL PROCEDURES & RULES

The following announcement was made at BMS on Thursday, 02/04/2021 at 8:35 a.m.; this text was also posted to the BMS Schoology page, which is automatically included in every students' Schoology feed.

Good morning and welcome Bedford students and staff, this is Dr. Rosen speaking. This is an exciting day for BMS! Starting today, our school is fully open, which means we have both Cohort A and Cohort B students together in school, and because of this increase to our in-school population, there are procedures and rules that all students are expected to follow and fully respect - these are designed to keep everyone as safe and healthy as possible. To be very clear, on behalf of all students, parents and staff, I am counting on you to uphold these expectations and fully cooperate with the following:

Updated Lunch Procedures for Full-In Model:

For Lunch Waves

- All students in grades 6, 7 and 8 have been assigned to a lunch table and there will be up to 4 students assigned to a lunch table;
- Students are to remain seated and there is no visiting other tables at any time during lunch;
- All lunch tables have plastic dividers do not move them or stand up during to speak over them during lunch;

• For Recess & Mask Break

- All students are required to go outside for recess & mask break;
- Face masks are to be worn at all times on the blacktop whether participating in 4-Square or Basketball, or watching and socializing, face masks are to be worn while on the blacktop.
- Face masks may come off for a mask break while on the concrete sidewalk and grass areas.
- Students should wash/disinfect their hands in school after engaging in play at recess; hand sanitizing stations are available in common areas throughout the schools.

Recess Equipment Hygiene

- Students may use basketballs and 4-Square balls;
- Students that want to play basketball or 4-Square will be provided with a ball; students are to wipe-down the playground equipment at the start of recess.
- Wiping down the equipment at the start of recess is consistent with hygiene practice in our Physical Education program and in classrooms where students wipe down their desks and equipment at the start of classes.

The BIG rules at BMS:

SAFETY AND SECURITY: Cell phones prohibited between 8:30 a.m. and 2:45 p.m.

 Please make sure you either power-down or silence your cell phone and store it securely in your backpack for the duration of the school day. The only exception to this rule is when you have direct permission from your teacher and only for instructional purposes. First offense is a warning; second offense the main office will hold your device for your parents to pick up.

• SAFETY AND SECURITY: Hats Off, Hoods Down

 For the safety and security of yourself and everyone in school, BMS does not permit students to wear hats or have their hoodies up inside the school building

• SAFETY AND SECURITY: No Airpods, Headphones, Earbuds

Students may not use or wear airpods/earbuds or headphones in the hallways and during lunch;
the only time you should be using these is when directed to do so by a teacher for instructional purposes;

• SAFETY AND SECURITY: Morning Arrival ---> Go Directly to First Period Class

 BMS students may enter the school building starting at 8 a.m.. All students are required to walk directly to their 1st period class location. There are no lockers assigned to any students and no areas between 8-8:30 for students to congregate; there is no stopping in the hallways.

• SAFETY AND SECURITY: Bus Transportation

 Students must wear a face mask securely covering the nose and mouth for the entire bus ride without exception


BLK History Month

Carter G. Woodson was the second African American to receive a doctorate from Harvard. Known as the "Father of Black History." Woodson dedicated his career to he field of African American History and obbied extensively to establish Black History Month as a nationwide institution. He also wrote many historical works, including the 1935 book The Afis-Education of the Nearo.



IMPORTANT STUDENT TECH REMINDERS!
